
Thanks to your generosity, we have been able to improve and expand our collection of books, audiobooks, kits, and digital resources. Additionally, donor funding enables us to provide robust programming for all ages, which counted nearly 17,000 participants in activities last year. The library is an essential partner in preparing children for academic success by fostering literacy development. During the 2022 Summer Reading Program, children logged more than 135,000 minutes of reading, which helped them return to school ready to learn. Offerings for adults included art classes, historical walking tours, book clubs, one-on-one technology assistance, and genealogy classes.

DISCOVERY ROOM

Thanks to gifts from Foundation donors, a new Discovery Room was incorporated into the children's area in 2022 to foster early literacy. With themes that change seasonally, the Discovery Room encourages families to explore, play, and learn together. In the fall, kids used their imagination to sell and shop at the farm stand. They tried out the cash registers, weighed apples on the scale, made change, and so much more. In the winter, families connected to the world around them as they learned more about things that are "so cold" – snowflakes, snow friends, icy winds, and, of course, ice cream. Spring brought the arrival of the garden center where seeds are planted and crops are harvested and sold.

Through these creative play opportunities, kids are developing valuable language and communication skills and building social connections.


A BRIDGE FROM OUR HISTORY TO THE FUTURE

SOME SAY THAT NEWSPAPERS ARE THE FIRST DRAFT OF HISTORY. For communities near Stillwater, that first draft will soon be much easier to access, with more than 85,000 pages of historical newspapers available online by the end of 2023.

We're pleased that our community's historic newspapers will now be much easier to access, whether here at the library or anywhere else with an internet connection. In recent years, we have seen a great increase of interest in family and local history research. Digitization will make it vastly easier to discover these personal and community stories.


Two grants totaling \$95,000 from the Fred C. and Katherine B. Andersen Foundation and the Hugh J. Andersen Foundation to the Library Foundation provided funding for the first phase of the newspaper digitization project, set to begin in 2023. The Stillwater Gazette Weekly, Stillwater Messenger, and Stillwater Daily Gazette will be made available for free on the MN Historical Society's Digital Newspaper Hub.



The Foundation also helps community members preserve their own stories. The library offered two community events to digitally archive personal photos and documents. Trained volunteers recruited by the Foundation-funded Volunteer Coordinator worked with staff to scan these special memories using professional equipment and provided digital copies to the community members to keep.


